Comments

The Colleges of the University of Cambridge already operate their admissions on a gathered field basis with a 15 October deadline for applications and, with the exception of those not invited to interview, decisions not being communicated to applicants until early January. We have no particularly strong preference between these options – this being more a matter for those HEIs directly affected by this question – but we would note that Option 1 is not consistent with the concept of decisions being made in the context of the gathered field – there has to be some time between the deadline for applications and the first communication of decisions.
